### First Aid: Eyes

Immediately flush eyes with plenty of water, occasionally lifting the upper and lower eyelids. Check for and remove any contact lenses. Continue to rinse for at least 10 minutes. Get medical attention.

#### First Aid: Skin

### Methods and materials for containment and cleaning up

### Small spill

Alternatively, if water-insoluble, absorb with an inert dry material and place in an appropriate waste disposal container. Dispose of via a licensed waste disposal contractor.

## Large spill

#### **Protective measures**

## Conditions for safe storage, including any incompatibilities

Eliminate all ignition sources. Separate from oxidizing materials. Keep container tightly closed and sealed until ready for use. ### **Engineering Measures**

If user operations generate dust, fumes, gas, vapor or mist, use process enclosures, local exhaust ventilation or other engineering controls to keep worker exposure to airborne contaminants below any recommended or statutory limits.

### **Environmental exposure controls**

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
